

Clinical History


- + 35 yo Man
 - + Cigs
 - + 36yo brother had MI 1 month earlier
- + Progressive decline over 48hours at OSH
- + Presents with profound dysarthria, pooling of oral secretions, no horizontal gaze, ataxia, L>R hemiparesis
- + NIHSS=18



Outcome

- + Rapid improvement on the table
- + Discharged to home post-op Day 3
- + At 6 months F/U
 - + Neurologically normal
 - + New job
 - + Vegetarian
 - + No cigs
 - + Angiogram- stents widely patent
- + Advocate for Stroke and Interventional
 - + Published book of his experience
