





SVIN Registry

The SVIN Registry's purpose is to create a national surveillance system to assess the characteristics, treatments, and outcomes of patients with large vessel and distal medium vessel occlusion acute ischemic strokes (LVOS and DMVOS). Additionally, to facilitate efforts to improve the quality and safety of LVOS/ DMVOS patient care and investigate novel quality improvement methods. The SVIN Registry currently has 12 active sites. As of December 2021 there has been a total of 3,452 patients entered into REDCap.



MISSION THROMBECTOMY

On behalf of all of the committees of **Mission Thrombectomy**, we want to thank you for your continued collaboration and partnership with the Society of Vascular and Interventional Neurology (SVIN) Mission Thrombectomy. Your support has assisted us in addressing global disparities, regional committee activation, and establishing World Stroke Thrombectomy Day (WTD)-May 15.

Mission Thrombectomy focuses on expanding access to stroke care and mechanically thrombectomy domestically and globally. We have significantly grown since 2016, when the concept of Mission Thrombectomy was first proposed to stakeholders and industry. Since that time, Mission Thrombectomy went from one committee intending to double mechanical thrombectomy globally by the year 2020 to over 89 regional committees in over 125 countries and strategic partnerships to aid in making public health awareness about stroke and mechanical thrombectomy, building stroke systems, hosting educational opportunities, conducting research and sharing best practices all with the goal in increasing access to mechanical thrombectomy regardless of a country's income or size. We continue this journey by focusing on six key strategic areas:




