#### **SVIN Registry**

The SVIN Registry's purpose is to create a national surveillance system to assess the characteristics, treatments, and outcomes of patients with large vessel and distal medium vessel occlusion acute ischemic strokes (LVOS and DMVOS). Additionally, to facilitate efforts to improve the quality and safety of LVOS/ DMVOS patient care and investigate novel quality improvement methods. The SVIN Registry currently has 11 active sites. As of December 2020 there has been a total of 2,219 patients entered into REDCap.

**Mission Thrombectomy 2020+** (MT2020) is a SVIN initiative with the goal to increase global access to stroke care and mechanical thrombectomy.

In 2020, the initiatives of MT2020+ focused on fulfilling the committee's purpose within SVIN through its mission to increase access to stroke care and mechanical thrombectomy globally. Currently, there are over 80 Regional Committees (RCs) that have been activated with 400+ members worldwide. Approximately 60 of the RCs have formally met to discuss challenges, barriers, and opportunities in their specific regions to focus their efforts on for the upcoming year.

The initiatives for MT2020+ in 2021 include multiple projects that provide industry with an opportunity to give input, attend, and participate in MT2020+ action items and events. The total annual cost to meet these goals is \$955,000. The funding breakdown is given below.
